

Intersegmental Project:

Professional Development for Mentor Teachers

Syllabus

Course Description:

Eight hours of professional development in coaching adult learning, inclusion, and instructional strategies for mentor teachers (district employed supervisors) of California P-12 schools who support candidates in teacher preparation programs.

Purpose

The new standards for teacher educator preparation require ten hours of initial preparation for district employed supervisors (mentors, master teachers, etc.) provided by approved teacher education preparation programs. These modules present eight hours that are portable to teacher preparation programs. The other two hours are provided by the specific teacher preparation program with which you are working.
